



File Manager

This operation manual describes both the SL-6000L and SL-6000N. “Zaurus” is used when describing both models, otherwise the model name is used.

The File Manager application allows you to look at files in the file system of the Zaurus. (For advanced users only)


The File Manager application can be used to open, copy, rename, delete, and move files. In order to use the File Manager application, the software contained in the accompanying CD-ROM must first be installed on the Zaurus. (See the separate Start-up Guide, “How to Install Applications on Your Zaurus” and the “Add/Remove Software” chapter in the Operation Manual.)

After the installation is completed, the File Manager application icon will appear on the Applications Home screen of the Zaurus.

Caution: *Do not use this application to modify files that are preinstalled on the Zaurus. Doing so may damage the operation of the Zaurus. If the applications do not operate properly, you need to perform a full reset “Format” in the Maintenance menu. When you perform the full reset “Format” you will lose all saved and created data and installed applications on the Zaurus (see the Start-up Guide). Be sure to backup the data files from the Zaurus to a memory card or the PC by using the Backup/Restore application prior to performing the “Format” function.*

Note: *This software has the “Execute with root privilege” setting. The “Execute with root privilege” is set to OFF by default, only files below “/home/zaurus” can be managed.*

To manage all files, tap and hold the “File Manager” application icon on the Applications Home screen for a few moments to open the Details screen.

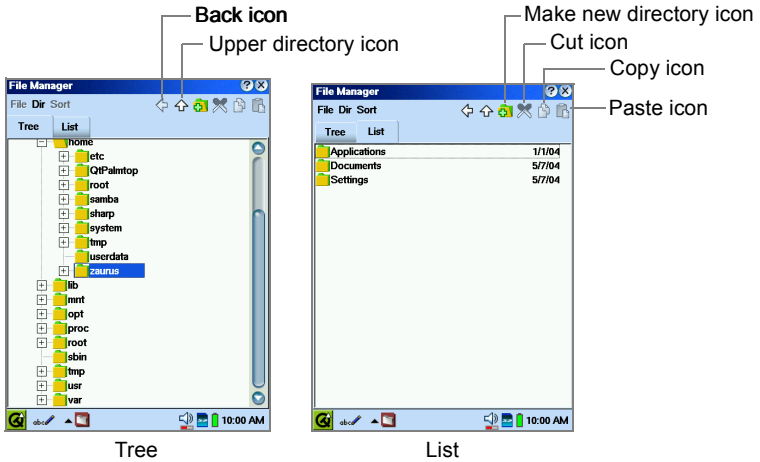
Then check the “Execute with root privilege”, and tap  to save the setting.

You can select the folders or files by pressing Space key.

Overview

1. In the Applications Home screen, tap the “File Manager” application icon. The File Manager screen appears. The File Manager Index screen will be displayed consisting of two tabs: Tree and List.

Index screen



Tree tab	Browses all folders in the Internal Flash memory and on the mounted memory cards in the “tree” format.
List tab	Browses all folders and files in the Internal Flash memory and on the mounted memory cards in the list format. Double-tap a file to open with the application related to the file.

File menu (when a folder is focused)	
Rename	Renames a folder.
Cut	Cuts the selected folders to paste later. Be sure not to close the File Manager application before doing a paste command. The folder you have cut will be erased from the clipboard.
Copy	Copies the selected folders.
Paste	Pastes the cut or copied folders.
Delete	Deletes the selected folders.
Select all	Selects all folders and files in the current directory.
Deselect all	Deselects all folders and files in the current directory.

File menu (when a file is focused)	
Open in (application name)	Opens the file with the application related to the file.
View as text	Opens the file with a Text Editor.
Rename	Renames a file.
Cut	Cuts the selected files to paste later. Be sure not to close the File Manager application before doing a paste command. The file you have cut will be erased from the clipboard.
Copy	Copies the selected files.
Paste	Pastes the cut or copied files.
Delete	Deletes the selected files.
Select all	Selects all files and folders in the current directory.
Deselect all	Deselects all folders and files in the current directory.
Dir menu	
Make new directory	Creates a new folder in the current directory and will be named "NewFolder". You can rename it immediately or later.
Back	Moves to the previous directory.
Upper directory	Moves to higher directory.
(Current directory)	Displays the current directory.
Sort menu (Sorts the folders and files in the List Index screen.)	
by Name	Sorts folders and files by name.
by Size	Sorts files by file size.
by Date	Sorts folders and files by date.
by Type	Sorts folders and files by type.
Ascending	Sorts all folders and files in ascending order when checked, or vice versa when not checked.
Back icon	Moves to the previous directory.
Upper directory icon	Moves to higher directory.
Make new directory icon	Creates a new folder in the current directory and will be named "NewFolder". You can rename it.
Cut icon	Cuts the selected folders or files to paste later. Be sure not to close the File Manager application before doing a paste command. The file you have cut will be erased.

Copy icon	Copies the selected folders or files.
Paste icon	Pastes one or more folders or files.

Note:

- *When you cut, copy or delete a folder or a file in the List Index screen, move the focus to the folder or the file by using the cursor key. Then select (highlight) it by pressing the **SELECT** key. If the folder or the file is not selected (highlighted), you cannot cut, copy or delete it. You can also perform these operations for multiple folders or files at a time by selecting (highlighting) them on the screen.*
- *The folder and file name are case-sensitive on Internal Flash memory, which are case-independent on a mount memory card.*
